01. REACHING THE UNREACHED:

Dr. Ambedkar Cultural Academy (DACA) supports initiatives on Dalit childrenfocused interventions by directly reaching out to a few thousand beneficiaries across 6 southern districts of Tamilnadu through various educational programmes such as Vidivelli (Morning Star) Girls' Home, Evening Study Centers (100 Centers in remote villages), JWL programme and Summer Camp.

DACA taking its preferential commitment for the quality education to the Dalit girls who belong to economically poor families is organizing every year Summer Camp (SC) with the intention of helping them to spend summer vacation meaningfully with lots of fun and frolic and at the same time selecting new candidates for Vidivelli Girls' Home.

02. SUMMER CAMP:

The children from remote villages of Tamilnadu during summer vacation tend to spend their time in playing with friends, watching movies, visiting temples and their relatives. According to them these activities help them to forget all their mental worries created by stressful school life. DACA gives an alternate opportunity for the girl children of Dalit Community to spend their summer vacation beneficially through well planned Summer Camp. This year, the Summer Camp (SC) 2019 was organized from April 26th to May 26th at the premises of DACA.

03. AIM OF THE CAMP:

The aim of the SC 2019 was 'to provide girl children with a pleasant and positive ambience away from their villages where they could celebrate their childhood and develop their innate talents and social skills'.

"We have a dream" was the unique theme of Summer Camp 2019, which inspired the participants to pick up various life skills and become creative, dynamic and productive young leaders of the society. It also instilled in them a strong faith that they are the future hope and backbone of their community.

04. TARGET GROUP:

Nearly 167 Dalit girls in the age group of 10 to 17 years (right age to mould) from different remote villages of 6 southern districts of Tamil Nadu were the beneficiaries of the camp.



05. THE DESIGNING OF THE CAMP:

The Camp was designed in such a manner to enhance the basic subject knowledge and improve the essential life skills required to achieve greater heights in life. Apart from these, the girls were also provided with ample of opportunities in the camp to discover their innate talents and unfold the same. The core ingredients of the camp were as follows:

- 01. Child psychology and goal setting.
- 02. Basic subject knowledge on Maths and English
- 03. Life Skill Management
- 04. Communication skills & How to Study
- 05. Computer skills
- 06. Art and craft work

- 07. Training on pencil drawing
- 08. Sessions on social analysis & Fundamentalism
- 09. Reading and writing skills
- 10. Lectures on improving handwriting.
- 11. Lectures on drafting petitions to Govt. Officials.
- 12. Training on Yoga and martial arts
- 13. Quiz sessions
- 14. Preparing of magazines
- 15. Drama and Dancing skills
- 16. Exposure to Madurai airport and other places
- 17. Basic Journalism
- 18. Awareness on Traffic Rules & safe driving
- 19. Ecological Concern



All these programs were given to girls by adopting innovative and creative methods. The play-way methods of learning helped them to increase their learning level at least by one step during this summer.



10. FRUITS GATHERED:

- ✓ Most of the girls felt at home and even ready to be here for some more days.
- ✓ Many came out of their stage fear and learnt to express their ideas in public and in small groups.
- ✓ Totally 176 registered their name for the camp, 163 remained till the end of the camp.
- ✓ Majority of the girls learnt the basics of Maths and English.
- ✓ 7 girls who learnt Karate in the camp participated in the national level competition and won Silver and Bronze medal.



OUR NATIONAL CHAMPIONS IN MARTIAL ARTS

- ✓ Most of the girls learnt the Basic Tamil letters and able to write without any mistakes.
- ✓ Many of them improved their hand-writing skills.
- ✓ We could identify many young artists in the group.
- ✓ Girls could publish their own magazine.
- ✓ Most of the girls learnt the skill of writing story on their own.

- ✓ All of them got a chance to use and learnt some basics of Computer. For some ofthem it is a first experience.
- ✓ All most all of them know answers for 350 GK questions and 250 English words.
- ✓ 10th &11th students learnt the Basics of English Grammar and cultivated the interest to learn further.
- ✓ Some of them developed Leadership quality.
- ✓ Some of them could identify their hidden talent of organizing programs. E.g.: the final day function was organized by the camp girls.
